


IHFA'S INVESTMENT IN IDAHO

In fiscal year 2019, IHFA helped create hundreds of jobs, spurred more than \$222 million in economic development and supported thousands of Idahoans on their path to homeownership. Below, you can see how our efforts have made a difference for Idahoans.

798 jobs created or retained

We've backed nearly \$70 million in small business loans in Idaho by providing collateral to support what would otherwise be non-bankable loans.



20,594 renters helped

We provide counseling for individuals and families receiving federal rental assistance. There are nearly 250 Idahoans enrolled in our self-sufficiency program, working toward secure employment, education goals, improved credit, and the ability to independently pay for adequate housing.



12,870 Idaho loans issued

We buy mortgage loans from more than 400 lenders in Idaho and six other states. In fiscal year 2019, IHFA purchased nearly 50,000 loans worth \$5.75 billion.



138,000 borrowers served

We collect house payments, pay property taxes and insurance, and help borrowers maintain or refinance home loans. Our work covers nearly \$16 billion in mortgage principal balances in seven states, including Idaho, Connecticut, Iowa, New Mexico, South Dakota, Texas, and Washington.



\$875,000 raised

Since 2011, Avenues for Hope, our annual fundraising campaign, has raised more than \$3 million to help 60 nonprofits that provide critical housing services in Idaho.



6,458 Finally Home! graduates

The homebuyer education program is designed to help first-time homebuyers become successful homeowners by educating and navigating them through the home-buying process. The industry-leading online course can be utilized by any state and is endorsed by Alaska, Arizona, Idaho, Iowa, and Utah.
